 In chapter Luqman, We read that when Hadhrat Luqman was giving advice to his son, the first and foremost on his mind was to remind his son, *ya bunayya aqimissalat* "O my dear son, observe Prayer!" (31:8)

For the rest of Imams, 'Asr starts when the shadow of an object becomes equal to its length (plus the length of its shadow at the time of Dhuhr). 'Asr ends as the sun begins to set.
